PLEASE NOTE: Our waste water & sewage disposal should be approximately the same quantities as our water delivered.

Also in the months of January, February And March we had trouble with our delivery truck therefore quantities delivered were lower than other months.

Part C:

All sites have undergone normal maintenance and the household garbage waste disposal site has been covered with ground when the cells have become full. We are planning to apply for funding under the the new GST Refund announced in the Budget to do some work on our waste disposal area. Plans are to erect a chain link fence, gate the property, and clean up the solid waste site. The government has not announced a timeframe for this funding so work we would want to do may have to wait until 2006/07 because of ordering material to be shipped in via summer barge.

Part D:

I cannot find any record here of data generated under the "Surveillance Network Program". We will start this program in the spring when the ice and snow melt and we have access to the runoff sites.

Part E:

There has been no unauthorized discharges.

Part F:

There has been no abandonment and/or restoration carried out. The covering and burying of household garbage is an ongoing exercise that we do as garbage cells fill up.

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Part G:

There have been no recent studies and none are planned in the near future.

Part H:

There have been no such requests.

Part I:

Our sewage waste site is a lagoon and there has been no removal of waste from the site.

Part J:

The new O&M Manual has been filed with the board and that is the only changes to our Operation and Maintenance Plans. The only other plans we have at this time is that we are putting in our budget for 2005/06 plans to put up chain link fence around the southern area of the waste disposal site complete with an entrance gate. If we get this completed it will secure the site.
