RE: PROJECT DESCRIPTION, RENEWAL OF TYPE B WATER LICENSE N7L1-1762, SHELL CANADA LIMITED, CAMP FAREWELL STAGING SITE.

During a meeting held January 26-28, 2011 the Environmental Impact Screening Committee (EISC) screened the above noted project description determining that it has deficiencies of a nature that warrant a termination of its consideration and the submission of another project description [IFA Section 11.(17)(d)]. A copy of the decision is attached.

In rendering its decision the EISC found that this development is subject to screening essentially due to the operating site, conditions, and procedures being significantly changed from those for which the development had previously been screened. The EISC has concerns about potential risks in the existence of an unmanned industrial facility essentially in a care and maintenance mode. The information provided by Shell is clearly inadequate for the purpose of determining the nature and probability of any negative environmental impacts. A new project description is required that describes the nature and extent of the proposed activities for the Camp Farewell Staging Site during the term of the Water License sought.

Shell is notified that this proceeding is now closed and upon submission of a satisfactory Project Description a new proceeding will commence.
