MGM has attached the "Scope of Work" for third party waste handling Contractor outsourcing and bidding process. This Scope of Work outlines the tasks, equipment specifications, roles and responsibilities, reporting, personnel and qualifications, and other standard contractual items.

Accordingly, MGM will provide notice to the Northwest Territories Water Board (Board) prior to the disposal of waste. MGM will consider this to be in compliance unless it hears otherwise from the Board.

### SCOPE OF WORK FOR DRILLING CUTTINGS HAULING RFP 2008-011

### Clarification of RFP Documents

Appendix A forms a part of the RFP for Drilling Cuttings Hauling for MGM for its Operations in the Mackenzie Delta (RFP# 2008-011).

Responses to Appendix A should be submitted as part of the RFP package. Interested bidders shall submit their proposals to the contact and address provided in Section 1.6 of the RFP no later than 12:00 noon. MST, on Nov 13, 2008 The RFP is structured so that all sections, including Appendix A, once combined (excluding instructions to bidders) become part of the Agreement between MGM and the successful bidder(s). Successful bidder(s) will be advised of contract award on or before November 21, 2008.

Note: Proposals should be brief in length and only address those specific requests outlined herein.

### Organization of RFP Response

It should be clearly understood by respondents that the work outlined in this RFP will be awarded to a single bidder..

It is expected that bidders will provide information on proposed methods, personnel and costs for completing these services.

#### Subject to Change or Cancellation

This RFP is issued in anticipation that the activities outlined herein will occur on lands within the Mackenzie Delta. Any drilling, seismic, or related activity will be dependent upon the corporate decisions made by MGM and all regulatory and environmental approvals. For these reasons, the requirements of this RFP are subject to change or cancellation by MGM at any time.

# 1.00 Scope of Work

1.1 MGM Energy Corp. is requesting quotations for equipment, costs and supervision to load, haul, unload and dispose of drill cuttings from the Mackenzie Delta to CCS's facility in Ft. Nelson, BC. The drill cuttings will be stock piled at three separate drilling locations in the Mackenzie Delta, NWT. These locations are on Ellice and Langley Islands, approximately 120 kms northwest of Inuvik, NWT which are accessible by temporary ice road.

The successful bidder will be expected to supply a fleet of trucks capable of completing the activities as described in 1.2 below. It is mandatory that the "fleet" includes all locally owned and operated trucks listed on the Inuvialuit Business List where the trucks meet the specifications set out in 1.2 below.

It will be the responsibility of the bidder to determine which Inuvialuit trucks meet the specifications set out in 1.2 below. These Inuvialuit Companies must be listed in 3.2, below.

Any trucks required beyond the number of locally owned and operated trucks, can be supplied from elsewhere and must similarly meet all required specifications.

- 1.2 Provision of tri-axle end dumps to pick up drilling cuttings from rig site and transport to Fort Nelson, BC for disposal
  - Tri-Axle End Dumps to meet the following specifications or equivalent:

  - First loads will start moving approx. early Feb. 2009
  - The current estimate is for 1500 cu.m of material to be shipped.
  - Cuttings could be either wet or dry or partially frozen.

  Mackenzie Delta drill sites to the CCS disposal facility in Ft. Nelson, BC.
- Manifesting loads at source, tracking manifests to disposal point, providing closure documentation to MGM Energy Corp. within one week of deposit of the waste at the CCS Ft. Nelson site.
- All fuel and lubes
- Insurance
- Provision of road worthy, inspected and licensed trucks
- Provision of licensed highway drivers who meet the requirements of the MGM Substance Abuse Policy (including mandatory pre-access drug and alcohol testing)
