RE: Camp Farewell Water Licence Application

Thank you for submitting to the Environmental Impact Screening Committee (EISC) your project summary for the above named project.

Under the Inuvialuit Final Agreement (IFA), section 11(36), “no licence or approval shall be issued that would have the effect of permitting any proposed development to proceed unless the provisions of [IFA section 11(36)] have been complied with”. This requirement has the effect of requiring competent authorities to give notice of applications for licences, permits or other authorizations to the EISC. These applications for proposed developments must be reviewed by the EISC to determine if they are subject to environmental impact screening.

The EISC has determined that the Shell Canada Energy project titled “Camp Farewell Water Licence Application” met the definition of development and that it was exempt from the screening process, as it qualifies to be exempt under exclusion # 1 of Environmental Impact Screening Guidelines, Appendix C.
